WELCOME BACK!

Returning to school after the holidays is always an exciting time – friends to catch up with and stories to share! Most importantly, our students have returned refreshed and ready to learn and I was delighted to hear about the swimming, fishing, trips to the city, camping, Pony Club, Jamboree and visits to grandparents – all important events in our family lives.

I am also pleased to see the great majority of children returning to school in correct summer uniform. All students are encouraged to identify with their school and wear correct uniform. It is very helpful (and may save parents money) if all clothing is clearly labelled – so much easier to return to owners. Many jumpers were laundered during the holidays but remain in storage as they do not have names.

Road safety is everyone's responsibility and I again take this early opportunity to remind parents of the need to be conscious of every child's safety particularly when dropping off in the morning and collecting in the afternoon. Albert Street becomes very busy during these peak times and each morning we witness children being directed across the road through the bus zone and/or cars pulling into the bus zone. Please model appropriate road safety strategies by parking and walking children across the designated pedestrian crossings. I also urge parents to speak to children about bicycle safety. Riding to school is fun and provides a great opportunity for exercise but it must be undertaken carefully, following road rules including the wearing of helmets. While students with bikes and scooters are walked across the designated crossing at the end of each day, we are concerned about the speed and actions of some riders as they cross other roads and zoom around the corner.

A busy calendar of Term 4 events includes the P&C twilight fete, transition activities for new kinder students, Year 2 to Year 3 and Year 6 to 7; K-6 presentation evening, discos, Year 6 farewell and much more! There is a calendar at the end of each newsletter and I encourage all parents to look at it and plan ahead to avoid missing any of the special events. The daily school news segment at approximately 7.10am on 2VM also provides a useful update/reminder.

Cricket: Last week the north west cricket team played in the state PSSA carnival at Wollongong and our district proudly boasted two players, Callum Cooper (MPS) and Billy Barwick (Gravesend). The team played extremely well winning two of their matches against Riverina and Polding. This placed North West 7th out of the 14 teams competing. Callum was particularly pleased with his bowling at the carnival with a ranking of 7 out of the 154 players participating. Congratulations, Callum!

is formal and based on democratic principles. Candidates are asked to prepare and deliver a brief speech of introduction, outlining their leadership qualities, at the primary assemblies.

As with any election process there is bound to be some disappointment when there is only a small number of positions available. While not every student will be elected just by nominating themselves, students show that they are willing to learn and grow.

Parents of Year 5 children are encouraged to talk with their child about nominating for a school leadership position.

Head Start into Kindergarten for student enrolling in Kindergarten in 2020 will commence soon. The *Head Start Program* includes two components:

- a family orientation morning to be held on Tuesday 5th November commencing at 10:00 am. All families who have a child enrolling in Kindergarten 2020 are encouraged to attend. The morning will begin in the hall with a Kindergarten item, introductions and a brief welcome. Parents will be taken on a tour of MPS and will culminate with a parent staff morning tea at 11:00am; and
- preschool visits to kindergarten classrooms for two morning sessions. Children will then visit the school with their pre-school group to meet teachers and participate in classroom activities.

Parents are advised that if you have not already submitted an enrolment form, please do so as quickly as possible. It is important that we have accurate information to plan classes for the beginning of the year. Children must turn five years of age by 31st July 2020 to be eligible to start school in 2020.
