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# **TERM 3 STAFF DEVELOPMENT DAY**

Unfortunately, we have had to change our Staff Development Day (SDD) also referred to as the student-free day in Term 3. This change has been necessary due to the availability of Staff Professional Learning facilitators. The day will change from Monday, 20 July to Friday 24 July. All students are to come to school on Monday, while alternative arrangements for students are to be made on Friday. This change has been made in consultation with Moree Public School P&C.

**Return to full-time face to face learning guidelines:** At Moree Public School we continue to follow strict guidelines from AHPPC and NSW Health. All students are expected to be learning on-site at school unless they are unwell or have a medical certificate to support their absence. In summary:

- existing infection control protocols at schools, and new health and safety measures put in place will help maintain the health and safety of students and staff;
- all activities permitted at school are safe and appropriate in a living with COVID-19 environment; and
- all students must bring their own drink bottles to school as our bubblers are out of use.

The planned excursions for Years 3 and 5 later this year have been cancelled. All other planned excursions for later in the year will be reviewed according to further Department of Education guidelines. Please enquire at the front office regarding requests for refunds. An application for refund arrangements is again attached to this newsletter.

**OC Class Application:** Changes have been made to the opportunity class placement process for 2020 - Year 4 students. The 2021 Year 5 opportunity class placement process was put on hold in April 2020 due to the COVID-19 situation. We now have a revised and simplified timeline for the OC placement process to ensure that students and families can have certainty about their placement as soon as possible.

The changes include:

• A new date for online applications. Parents must apply between 9 June 2020 and 26 June 2020. Late applications cannot be accepted.

• A new test date - Wednesday 16 September 2020.

To ensure fair and consistent assessment of students across New South Wales, students will be offered places based only on their test results this year – there will be no school assessment scores.

Student Code of Conduct on buses: Many students travel to and from school by bus with 15 buses servicing our school. In the interest of safe travel, we join with Moree bus operators in reminding students and families of their obligations relating to behaviour. ## 2. EXCURSIONS – OPTIONS FOR REFUND

Our processing of refunds must comply with the DoE financial system. This means that a refund must be made as per your original payment method. If you paid by:

• Cash/cheque it will be via Electronic Funds transfer and to process an EFT refund, we require bank details;

• POP original payment method - POP payments must be refunded via POP;

• EFTPOS original payment method – to be processed via EFTPOS back to the original credit card and in the same amounts as the payments - to comply with banking rules; OR you may opt for

• Fees in Advance – Monies already paid can be held *in fees in advance* for a future payment or for a sibling. *Fees in Advance* can be used for 2021 payments.

# 2 Student Code of Conduct

The following Code of Conduct sets out acceptable standards of behaviour for students travelling on school buses and regular route buses.

Students are expected to follow these rules for the safety and comfort of all passengers, including themselves. If the rules are not followed, it may lead to the withdrawal of travel passes for subsidised travel, banning students from travelling on buses, and even police prosecution and court action.

## CODE OF CONDUCT FOR SCHOOL STUDENTS ON BUSES

It is every student's responsibility to behave in a manner that ensures the safety and comfort of passengers and drivers. This includes:

Behaviour on buses:

- Use appropriate language not offensive or racist language
- Fighting, spitting, feet on seats, throwing things in or from the bus is not permitted
- No eating or drinking (other than water) unless for medical reasons or the bus operator gives written
  permission.
- Offer seats to adults including people with a disability, elderly or expectant mothers
- Do not push or shove other people
- Do not bully or harass other passengers or the driver
- Avoid attracting the attention of the driver except in the case of emergency
- Do not play music at such volume that it may distract the bus driver or other passengers

### Safety on and near buses:

- Obey reasonable directions from the driver (e.g. where to sit or to remain in the bus)
- Remain in your seat do not move around the bus unnecessarily
- If standing, remain behind the front passenger seat and keep a secure hand hold at all times
- Keep bags and other items clear of the aisle
- Do not allow any part of your body to protrude out of the bus at any time
- Wait for the bus in a quiet and orderly manner including at bus interchanges
- Stand away from the roadside until the bus comes to a complete stop
- Allow other passengers to leave the bus before stepping onto the bus in a single line
- Wait until the bus stops before moving to get off the bus at your designated stop
- · Wait until the bus leaves the stop and you have clear vision before crossing the road
- Cross the road where and when it's safe to do so, use crossings/traffic lights where available

### Legal considerations on buses:

- Wear the seat belt properly adjusted and fastened, if one is available
- Obey the law that bans smoking on buses
- Ensure that buses are not vandalised report any damage, e.g. graffiti and window etching, to the driver
- Do not interfere with bus property, equipment and signage
- Do not leave rubbish on the bus, or at bus stops or interchanges

### Using bus passes:

- Show travel passes or tickets to the driver on boarding and to Authorised Revenue Protection Officers, NSW Police Officers or bus company representative when requested
- Use the travel pass only for its intended purpose do not lend your pass to other students or borrow a pass from them
- Swipe or 'dip' passes in ticket readers if available when boarding
- If issued with a School Opal card, always tap on when boarding and tap off when leaving the bus
